### **EXPLORING THE WORD**

As Jesus stands in the synagogue, he reads from the scroll handed to him; it contains the words of the prophet Isaiah. Through this text, Jesus announces God's salvation. The "year acceptable to the Lord" is a reference to the Jewish tradition of Sabbath years and jubilee. The Sabbath year was observed every 7th year. A year of Jubiliee was celebrated every 50th year. It was a year of renewal in which debts were forgiven and slaves were freed. Jesus is Yahweh's Anointed One, filled with the Spirit of God. The Kingdom of God is now at hand. It is made present in Jesus, in his life, death, and Resurrection. Jesus will send the Holy Spirit so that the Kingdom of God can be fulfilled. The Holy Spirit is Jesus' gift to the Church. The Holy Spirit enables the Church to continue the mission of Jesus. When we do what Jesus did—bring glad tidings to the poor, liberty to captives, healing to the sick, and freedom to the oppressed-we serve the Kingdom of God.
